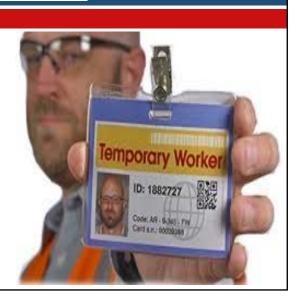

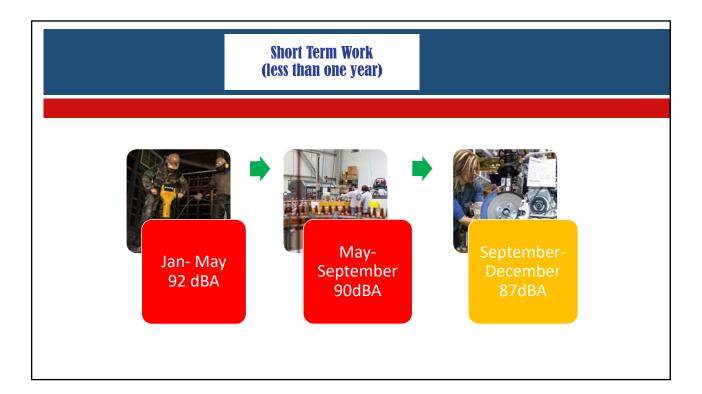

Staffing Agency Responsibilities

- ✓ Become familiar with noise exposure hazards and controls in place
- ✓ Generic training
- ✓ Audiograms*
- √ Temp workers follow rules of host employer
- ✓ Maintaining communication





Real Life Examples

Bottling Company

29 CFR 1910.95(g)(5)(i): The employer did not establish, within 6 months of an employee's first exposure at or above the action level, a valid baseline audiogram against which subsequent audio grams can be compared:

The employer did not obtain a valid baseline audiogram for temporary employee's first exposure at or above the action level of 85 dBA as an 8 hour time-weighted average.
