



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#### Staffing Employment Has Exhibited Anemic Growth in 2024





Labor Churn in 2023 by Sector (Hires/Separations)










#### Reduction in 55+ Workers Is Driving Labor Shortages in Certain Sectors

Change in the 55+ Workforce between 2018 and 2023 by Sector





 $\Delta$  in the Naturalized/Non-Citizen Workforce



Job Creation in 2023 by Establishment Size and Sector





 $\Delta$  in the Workforce with Telework Allowances



Job Fill Rate by Sector (Hires/Job Openings)







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#### Temporary Help Declined Amidst Strong Overall Employment









#### Temporary Help Declined Amidst Strong Overall Employment



#### **MAJOR Legislative Victory**

- California AB 2741 withdrawn—harmful antistaffing bill
  - Bill rate disclosure
  - Conversion fee ban
  - Client hiring of temporary workers
- Power of grassroots advocacy
  - ASA lobbyist Mike Robson
  - Staffing firms
  - Clients





#### **MAJOR Litigation Victory**

- Court enjoins Illinois equal benefits mandate
  - ASA, SSAI, three staffing firm plaintiffs
  - Erisa pre-emption
  - State plans to appeal
- Spillover effect—New Jersey Temporary Worker Bill of Rights
  - Contains similar benefits mandate
  - ASA to initiate Erisa claim
  - Miller & Chevalier





#### Other Victories—Health Care

- lowa: health care rate caps
- Rhode Island: Joint Commission exemption repeal





#### Moral of the Story

- Grassroots advocacy is essential
- Time to start is NOW
- Grassroots Advocacy Tool Kit





#### Continuing and Novel Enforcement

- DOJ enforcement—staffing targeted for immigration violations
  - \$100,000 fine against staffing firm
  - Allegedly discouraged non-U.S. citizens from applying
- Artificial intelligence
  - Lie detector statutes
